RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Township of West Orange (“Township”) and Borough of Roseland (“Roseland”) have previously executed Inter-Local Agreements whereby the Township provides Roseland with certain animal control services in exchange for quarterly payments by Roseland to the Township (the “Inter-Local Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, the last Inter-Local Agreement expired on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Township provided the annual control services for Roseland from July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 after the expiration of the last Inter-Local Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Township and Roseland negotiated an interim agreement for the six-month period from July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 (the “Interim Agreement”), annexed hereto as Exhibit “A,” whereby Roseland agreed to pay the Township the sum of \$7,413.95, for the six-month term from July 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Township and Roseland have also negotiated a new Inter-Local Agreement for a two-year term from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, under the new Inter-Local Agreement, the Roseland will pay the Township the sum of \$15,569.30 per year to be prorated on a quarterly basis of \$3,892.33 per quarter for the contract year 2021 and the sum of \$16,347.77 per annum to be prorated on a quarterly basis of \$4,086.94 per quarter for the contract year 2022; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution further authorizes that twenty-five (25%) of the per year amount for each contract year of the Inter-Local Agreement be dedicated to and placed in the dog license account 04-2010-00-6690-304 to cover the cost of personnel and other expenses authorized under the Inter-Local Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Township’s Health Officer has reviewed both the Interim Agreement and the new Inter-Local Agreement and recommends execution of the terms contained therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Interim Agreement and the new Inter-Local Agreement with Roseland, Roseland has agreed to indemnify the Township for any services provided for the Borough, as stated in Schedule A attached to the Inter-Local Agreement;

NOW, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Orange that the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to execute and counter-sign: (i) the Interim Agreement, annexed hereto as Exhibit “**A;**” and (ii) the new Inter-local Agreement with the Borough of Roseland, annexed hereto as Exhibit “**B;**” and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Municipal Clerk be and is hereby authorized to attest to the Mayor’s signature on both the Interim Agreement and the new Inter-Local Agreement with the Borough of Roseland.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 7, TRAFFIC, SUBSECTION 7-19, THROUGH STREETS AND SUBSECTION 7-21.2, MULTI-WAY STOPS NEAR SCHOOLS, PLAYGROUNDS AND YOUTH RECREATIONAL FACILITIES OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST ORANGE

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Orange, in the County of Essex, State of New Jersey, that the intersection of Forest Avenue and Ellis Street be designated as a Multi-Way Stop pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(d) under the Municipal Engineer’s Certification and License Number GE026706 and that the limits of Forest Avenue being designated a Through Street be amended to reflect the Multi-Way Stop as follows:

Section 1. The Township Council of The Township of West Orange finds it in the interest of public safety to designate the intersection of Forest Avenue and Ellis Street as a Multi-Way Stop pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(d).

Section 2. The Municipal Engineer of the Township of West Orange has submitted and certified all the legislative requirements pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(d) and specifically that both Forest Avenue and Ellis Street are under municipal jurisdiction; that their intersection is within 500 feet of a school, or of a playground or youth recreational facility; and that the intersection is on a street contiguous to a school, or playground or youth recreational facility.

Section 3. Subsection 7-21.2, Multi-Way Stops Near Schools, Playgrounds or Youth Recreational Facilities, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of West Orange is hereby amended and supplemented as follows pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(d) (*italic type denotes deletion, bold type denotes addition*):

Section 4. Subsection 7-19, Through Streets, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of West Orange is hereby amended and supplemented as follows (*italic type denotes deletion, bold*

type denotes addition):

Name of Street	Limits
<i>Forest Avenue</i>	<i>Eagle Rock Avenue and Woodland Avenue</i>
Forest Avenue	a. Eagle Rock Avenue and Ellis Street b. Ellis Street and Woodland Avenue

Section 5. If any provisions of this Ordinance or application thereof, under any circumstances, is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect any of the provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the valid provision(s) or application and to this end, the provisions of the Ordinance are severable.

Section 6. All other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 7. Unless another penalty is expressly provided by New Jersey Statute, every person convicted of a violation of any provision of this Ordinance or any supplement thereto shall be liable to the penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for a term not to exceed fifteen (15) days or both.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

This Ordinance, which amends the Traffic Regulations of the Township, designates the intersection of Forest Avenue and Ellis Street as a Multi-Way Stop with stop signs on all intersecting streets. This designation is made pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(d) which allows municipalities to designate any intersection as a stop intersection, including multi-way stops, provided both streets are under municipal jurisdiction; that the intersection is located within 500 feet of a school, or of a playground or youth recreational facility; and that the intersection is on a street that is contiguous to a school, or playground or youth recreational facility. The Municipal Engineer certified that the intersection of Forest Avenue and Ellis Street meets all three criteria.
